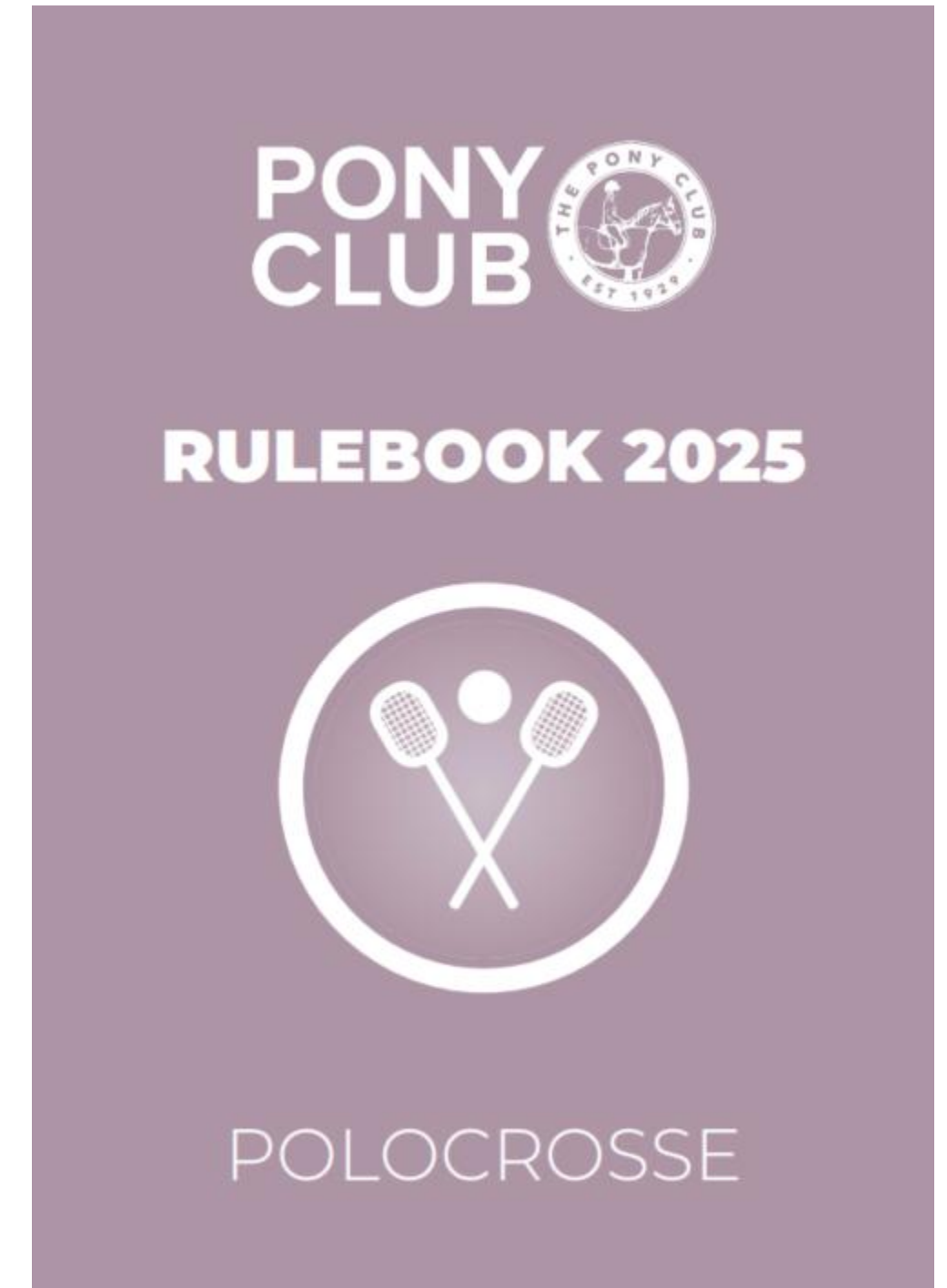

Competitions



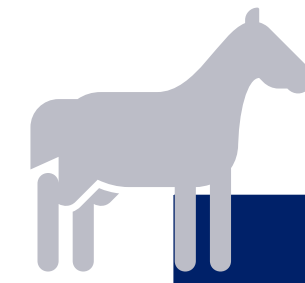
- Deliver a successful 2026 calendar of competitions and qualifiers

Training / Coaching



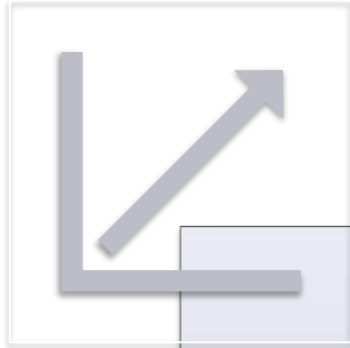
- Deliver more training resources and materials to help members, coaches and volunteers train, themselves, horses and to be involved with the sport

Centres



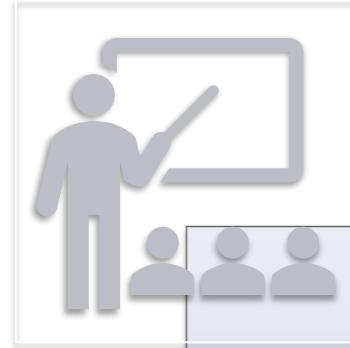
- Work with the PC office and the Centres committee to develop polocrosse in more Pony Club Centres and get more Centre Members playing
